

Measles outbreak

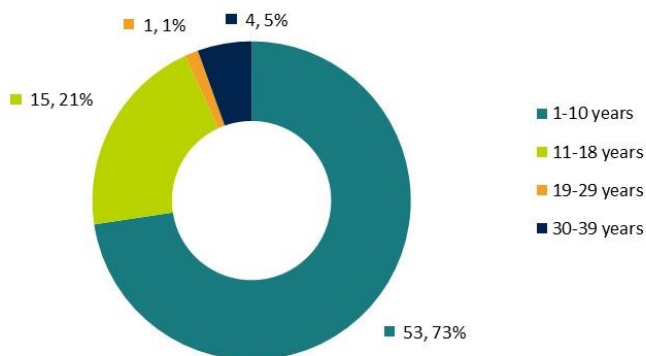


Clark County Public Health

A health care provider notified Clark County Public Health of the first suspect measles case on Dec. 31. On Jan. 4, lab results confirmed the first measles case. Within 10 days, case counts grew to three confirmed and 11 suspect cases. Public Health activated Incident Command on Jan. 15 to manage the outbreak and spent 63 days in incident response.
